

POSTER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

The poster session is an excellent opportunity to communicate your project in a synthesized and illustrated way. Because a poster is a type of visual communication, you should limit the amount of text and use **illustrations, diagrams and graphs**.

Please follow these guidelines for the content of your poster:

Size: A1 format (594 x 841 mm)

The poster should illustrate your **Nature based Solution** project pointing out:

1. **Identity card of the project:**

- **Issue of Climate change:** floods, erosion, drought, heat, etc.
- **Type of ecosystem:** river, forest, coast, etc.
- **Type of NbS:** Ecosystem restoration, infrastructure related, ecosystem based-management, etc.
- **Project leader and partners:** NGO, government, association, university.
- **Calendar:** Information on the calendar of activities. Restoration project started in 1997, restoration works carried out between 1998 and 2015.
- **Funding:** government (%), internal funding (%) and external funding (%).

2. **Objectives:** ex. Reduce the risk of floods, increase the surface area of the riverbed, etc.

3. **Context of administration:** Project LIFE, local project, etc.

4. **Description of the project:** Tell us about the project.

5. **Results**

- Social benefits
- Environmental benefits
- Economic benefits

6. **Difficulties encountered:** Tell us about the challenges you faced during your project.

7. **Monitoring process:** how is the monitoring carried out.

8. **Next steps:** what are the next steps of the project?
